

**CBIG-SCREEN** is an EU-funded project that aims to reduce inequality by improving the offer of cervical cancer screening to vulnerable groups of women. Though cervical cancer screening programmes drastically reduce cervical cancer mortality, they remain largely inaccessible and underused by subpopulations of vulnerable women, exacerbating inequality.

Within CBIG-SCREEN, we will adapt established intervention models, for instance HPV selfsampling, to local context of three pilot countries (Estonia, Portugal, and Romania) to increase access to cervical cancer screening in subgroups of vulnerable women.

## How can you contribute?

- To meet the needs of the vulnerable groups in our survey countries, namely Bulgaria, Denmark, Estonia, France, Italy, Portugal, or Romania, we strive to consult stakeholders at all levels. You may wish to join a Collaborative User Board (CUB) to ensure that the development and implementation of interventions meet local requirements, is context-specific and takes into account pre-existing and new challenges, or help us identify suitable actors for the CUB.
- CBIG-SCREEN's approach is participatory and co-creational, focusing attention on the needs and wants of vulnerable groups and seeking to balance perspectives and ideas of all stakeholders. Our co-creation partners will help us generate knowledge and ideas, building on the evidence-base and considering the acceptability and feasibility of interventions identified in the context of their countries.

- As a policymaker you will benefit from receiving evidence-based information on the success of key components of interventions aimed at enhancing efficiency, equity, and patient autonomy in vulnerable populations at high-risk of developing cervical cancer.
- CBIG-SCREEN intends to implement our findings and tools into healthcare practice, ensuring that countries can adapt the intervention to their need. We will engage with politicians, cancer groups and patient representatives at the EU and partner country level to ensure CBIG-SCREEN provides you with the tools to determine where and how much to invest in cervical cancer screening (CCS) so they can reach or exceed the WHO CCS targets within the Global strategy to accelerate the elimination of cervical cancer.
