On the 19th November 2025, we hosted the CBIG-SCREEN Project Roundtable at the European Parliament in Brussels — an exchange on advancing equitable cervical cancer screening across Europe. It brought together policymakers, cancer researchers, health professionals and civil society organisations.

The discussions and project outcomes highlighted:

- Cervical cancer screening saves lives by finding it early yet only if everyone has access.
- Information is key increase health literacy and train health professionals.
- Increasing uptake can cost less overall because of savings in treatment costs and it also saves lives
- Co-creation and participation of vulnerable groups in intervention and policy design that respond to real-world issues and diverse settings.
- Need for **reliable and transparent systems** to strengthen effective prevention strategies.
